1) Label the 7 continents on your globe template.

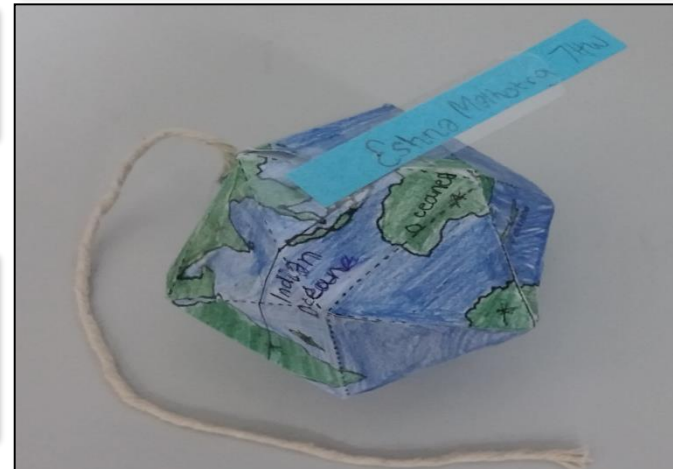
2) Label the main oceans on your globe template.
